

I, Annamarie V. Sandecki, former Director of *Tiffany & Co. Archives* and founding member of the *International Antique Jewelers Association Expertise (IAJA Expertise)*, hereby declare that, in my opinion, the piece described below is a genuine Tiffany item:

Bracelet Platinum, Iridium, Diamonds, Pearls Tiffany & Co., New York, circa 1956-1959

A platinum, iridium, diamond, and pearl bracelet designed to appear as a garland of six pear-shaped flower buds. Alternating between pointing upward or downward, each bud is composed of nine graduated pearls surrounding a marquise-cut diamond accented on its side with one round-cut diamond. Each bud is topped by two diamond-set leaves with each leaf set with two round-cut diamonds. The buds are connected by six curling diamond-set stems. Each stem is set with 17 round-cut graduated diamonds.

In the 1950s Tiffany catalogs and advertisements highlighted several diamond flower-themed bracelets. However cultured pearls were not incorporated into the bracelets' designs until 1956, when Tiffany began using them. This bracelet is one of the earliest known examples of a Tiffany cultured pearl jewel.
